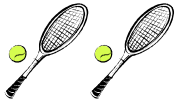

Two Major Projects for Weatherly This Year

As you know, our front entrance has been in a state of flux due to the recent addition of the streetlights and our new traffic light on Weatherly Club Drive. As soon as the power company completes its work on the power at the entrance, we will be reworking the landscape in the middle and side sections.

Additionally, money has been budgeted to start replacing signs along Weatherly Club Drive and to replace signs that are broken or faded in other key sectors of our neighborhood. The goal is to convert all of our signs to the newer black metal signs that are already in use in several of our sectors. These will look much better and require less maintenance than the original wooden signs.

Future Weatherly Events

The WRA Events Committee is anticipating increasing clubhouse activities for the entire community. We know that not everyone uses the pool and tennis courts, so we are making an effort to utilize the facility for other community events.

We are planning a summer karaoke party, health fairs, a police bicycle safety program for children, senior events and other community-oriented programs that may be of interest to young or old in Weatherly.

On previous occasions, we have had wonderful participation. Last year's "9/11 Memorial Blood Drive" was a great success. The Red Cross was concerned that we might not meet a 25-unit minimum collection, but we drew 54 good units for the community. Of course, the timing for that event occurred right after the Katrina hurricane disaster. **This year the annual blood drive will be Saturday, Sept. 9th.**

Our Christmas events were also well received. There was a great turnout for the children's party and while the adult saxophone event was yummy and entertaining, we would like to see more people there to enjoy it. We will work on scheduling a time this year that is more convenient for everyone.

FEEDING DUCKS AT OUR PONDS

A concerned resident from Glen Abbey sent this letter for us to consider when we go to the Weatherly Residential Association pond at the front, and even at the other ponds in the neighborhood. It's great advice and will help us not to harm the ducks and geese.

"I majored in Wildlife Management at Auburn and worked as a wildlife biologist for the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Because of my background, many of my neighbors wanted me to write a piece in the Weatherly News Bulletin to help in educating all of you who are interested in keeping out waterfowl around and healthy for awhile. Most of the time, I see neighbors feeding the ducks and/or geese bread or crackers or some other processed food item. The animals as well as most wild animals cannot digest these foods well and although they seem very pleased to be fed, these processed foods will kill them sooner than later. If you want your children to see them up close and personal and want to feed them, feed them what bird species eat, i.e., cracked corn, birdseed, sunflower seeds, etc. You can buy them anywhere for not much and you will help protect our wildlife in our neighborhood. Their main diets around here are grass seeds and insects. Hope this information is helpful and you will spread the word about what these waterfowl species should be fed. Thanks.
